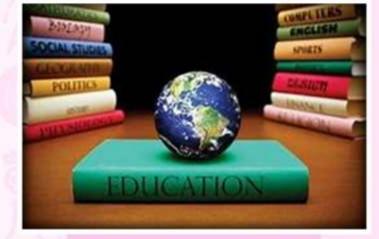
Education is like a super power that is changing our world in incredible ways! When we learn new things in school, it is like gathering tools for a grand future adventure.

Doctors use special gadgets made by technology to see inside our bodies and help us feel better. It is like having magical tools that help them figure out how to keep us healthy.

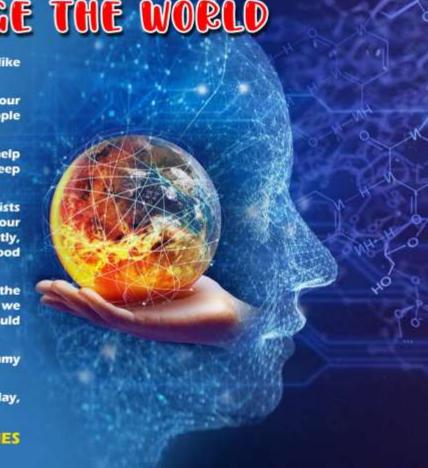

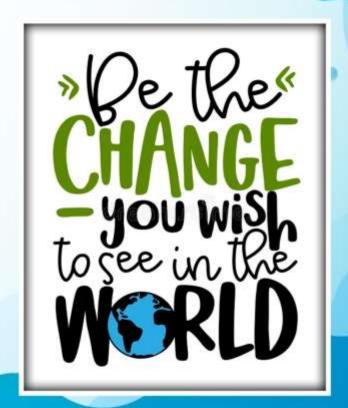

APTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE The Good, The Bad and The Scary

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is machine-displayed intelligence that simulates or mimics human behaviour or thinking and can be trained to solve specific problems. Al is a combination of Machine Learning techniques and Deep Learning. Types of Artificial Intelligence models are trained using vast volumes of data. These tools have the ability to make intelligent decisions.

All is rapidly changing the world, impacting nearly every industry and aspect of our lives. From self-driving cars to personalized medicine, it is helping us to solve some of the world's most pressing challenges and also creating new opportunities.

One of the most significant ways that AI is changing the world is by automating tasks that are currently performed by humans. This is leading to increased productivity and efficiency in many industries, as well as the creation of new jobs that require AI skills and expertise. For example, AI-powered chatbots such as Google Bard and GPT-4 are now being used to provide customer service, and AI-powered software is being used to automate tasks such as accounting and legal research.

In medicine, AI has shown its prowess in many fields, notably, disease detection, personalized medication, surgical treatment and health monitoring, among others. An example is the detection of the common yet life-threatening disease sepsis, which causes the immune system to overreact at the site of infection, often damaging cells or whole organs in the process. AI can detect sepsis as many as 6 hours before a professional can, leading to a reduction of 30% in sepsis-related mortality rates.

Today AI is a huge part of our day-to-day lives. It is integrated in almost every technology-related item. Face unlock, for instance, is a common feature on hundreds of smartphones. It usually involves taking a few pictures of your face from different angles and using artificial intelligence to save the exact features of the face in the pictures. While trying to unlock the phone, the AI kicks in again and finds new facial features and tries to compare them to the preset photo of your face. If it is a match, the phone unlocks. Other examples include vehicle crash/object detection software, email and call spam filters, and of course, smart devices such as Alexa, Siri and Google Home.

Al has been a game-changer in security. Law enforcement agencies and cybersecurity firms can use Al for facial recognition, surveillance and threat detection. These technologies enhance public safety and combat cybercrime by identifying and neutralizing potential threats before they get the chance to become dangerous. It has also been used for biometrics viz. advanced fingerprint, iris or voice recognition which are features unique to each human and extremely difficult to replicate.

In the manufacturing industry, Al-powered robots are being used to perform repetitive tasks on assembly lines, freeing up human workers to focus on more complex and strategic activities. These robots can perform tasks with greater precision and consistency than humans, leading to increased productivity and reduced errors.

However, there are always two sides to a coin. While AI has the potential to revolutionize healthcare, transportation, and many other fields, it also raises concerns about its potential misuse. As new features are rolled out regularly, the chances and occurrences of AI-related cyber-attacks keep increasing. A security report by Check Point Research in August 2023 showed that there was an 8% increase in weekly AI-USB cyber-attacks (where AI has been used in USB devices for disruptive purposes).

Another concerning use of AI are deepfakes. Deepfakes are AI-generated images, audio and videos that try to resemble a person's appearance and manner of speaking and 'impersonate' him/her in the created content. Examples of deepfakes are the Pope break-dancing in a puffy jacket as seen in a viral video, a deepfake of Mark Zuckerberg as a response to a bad decision made by Facebook and a supposedly 'drunk' Nancy Pelosi in a news conference.

Nowadays everyone is on the internet, especially on social media platforms such as Instagram, YouTube and Facebook. All has been integrated into these platforms to show you more content and keep you for longer viewing rates on their platform. Such All is sometimes concerning as they use cookies and trackers to follow you around the internet and track your activity. Now you know why a flurry of related videos and ads popped up when you did that research homework!

On the lines of tracking programs, with the existing features of facial recognition, AI can be extremely dangerous with combined databases. With AI being incredibly good at identifying features of a person / animal, sensitive information from high-security databases such as roadside camera databases, certain social media / bank databases can be leaked into the hands of bad actors, and with the newest spy cameras which are less than 2 inches long (src: alfredcamera.com), people can be recorded and tracked from the so-called 'comfort of their homes'. The information can then be used to discriminate against them or sold to a data broker for commercial purposes like marketing, profiling or selling.

Unfortunately, AI is not solely to be blamed for the multiple dangers and risks it poses to society. We humans are equally responsible as AI can be incorrectly programmed and can produce unreliable, inaccurate or biased results due to poor design, improper and sometimes unacceptable data quality and format. This kind of data should be immediately investigated, and if possible, shut down or deleted. With such faulty data and incorrect predictions, AI could become a source of discontent, inconvenience and danger.

Conclusion

Artificial intelligence is a powerful and transformative technology that can have positive or negative impacts on society, depending on its use and governance. While it can have many benefits, like any other revolutionary tool, it can also pose serious risks and challenges to human rights, by collecting, analysing, predicting and influencing data and future behaviour for detrimental purposes. Therefore, it is important to ensure that AI is developed and used in a responsible, ethical, and human-centric way that respects the rights, values, and interests of all people. In conclusion, AI should be developed as a tool for human empowerment and enhancement, and not as a threat or a replacement.

BE THE CHANGE YOU WISH TO SEE LIFESTYLE CHANGES FOR A BETTER ENVIRONMENT

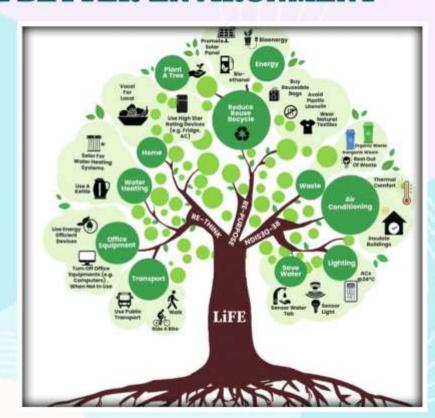

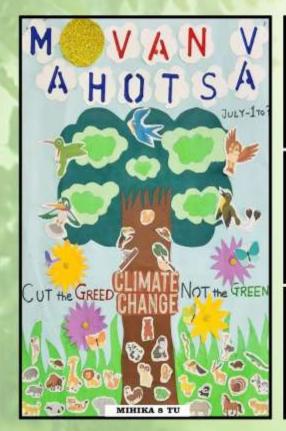

Students as agents of community awareness

It was for the very first time that the students of St. Francis School (CISCE), in a novel initiative, organized a street play in order to educate the public on the dangers of media addiction. The play titled 'Media Se Nahi, Zindagi Se Judiye' was enacted by a few talented students of the Secondary Section of our school on Saturday, 21st October, 2023 near the 'I LC.' Signage on Road No. 2 in I.C. Colony, Borivali (West).

The Street Play commenced at 10 a.m. sharp with a trumpet fanfare to announce the start of the play as well as to invite pedestrians to watch the play. Twenty-five students from grades 6 to 9 were trained for the performance across a span of three months. A team of dedicated teachers worked tirelessly to showcase the hidden potential of our cast of student performers.

The 15 minute performance powerfully depicted the detrimental effects of being addicted to social media. The students put up a rip-roaring performance with their strong stage presence. Right from shouting out powerful slogans on media addiction to aptly depicting ordinary lives of people, the students successfully conveyed the message – that is the need to use social media mindfully. The play also emphasized how addiction to Instagram can be a real problem for some teens today. It further stressed on excessive gaming habits. Two time periods (1980s and 2023) were well depicted to make clear how social media affected our lives back then versus now.

The Street play reinforced the fact that any kind of media addiction results in neglecting hobbies or responsibilities and one can face a range of negative consequences including social isolation, poor academic/work performance, and mental health problems such as anxiety and depression. Meaningful and creative placards were also used to create a stronger impact and make the message as clear as possible. In fact, the people who gathered to watch were so enthralled by the concept and the performance that the students were asked to repeat the performance. In conclusion, the message that went out was that media addictions are real and one needs to be mindful of their use without affecting the quality of their lives.

Kudos to our Principal, Bro. Wilfred Monteiro, for always encouraging us to explore new possibilities as educators. This novel initiative of a street play was not only a learning experience but also a wonderful opportunity for students to realize their important role as agents of change in the community at large.

Bullying Awareness Week

Bullying Awareness week was organized from 17th July -21st July, 2023. A variety of activities were implemented during the week to increase awareness among the students, staff and parents of our school. Here is a brief look at how the week went:

The week started off with a theme assembly conducted by Class 8, on 'Bullying'. The different ways bullying occurs and how a student can deal with it were depicted in the short skit. Student Council members briefly addressed information on what students need to know about different forms of bullying (physical, verbal, social and cyber bullying) and some ways of addressing the issue, during the morning assembly each day of the week.

A focus on 'Friendship and Bullying' for the school flannel board display, including the Student Council Boards, for the month of July was planned, to foster greater awareness on different aspects of bullying in the school. A special 'Bullying' module was planned and taught in the classes (Classes 1 to 8) during the Value Education period for Bullying Awareness Week.

A Survey was conducted with a random selection of 30 students each, from classes 9 and 10, to better understand student viewpoints on bullying in the school premises. A guide for parents (soft copy), on the various aspects of bullying which parents need to be aware of, to guide their children, was prepared and sent to parents of the school. A 'Bullying Reporting' mechanism involving Student Council members, in coordination with teacher In-charges and relevant school authorities was explained to students during assembly and implemented. The students of the Council body were trained on how to handle and report issues related to bullying in the school premises. Permanent and prominent display of anti-bullying messages across all the floors of the school was done in the form of specially designed boards, to help remind everyone

in the premises of many aspects of bullying which were addressed during the week.

"Great opportunities to help others seldom come, but small ones surround us every day."

On 22nd July, 2023 a Charity drive was organized by St. Francis School (CISCE), Borivali (West) at Navjeevan Society, a school for hearing impaired children in Wada, Dist. Palghar. The drive which was spearheaded by our school Principal, Bro. Wilfred Monteiro, surpassed all expectations, despite the challenging rainy weather conditions. The visiting team comprised of our Principal, twelve members of the school Student Council and the two Council In-charge teachers. All of us were deeply impacted by this extraordinary visit to Navjeevan Society.

Unfortunately, children with such disabilities may be overlooked and sometimes considered burdensome in society. They may also lack access to proper infrastructure for training, which can hinder them from showcasing their true talents and experiencing a meaningful childhood. Moreover, their inability to communicate effectively leaves them vulnerable to social evils like abuse, trafficking, and exploitation.

At Navjeevan Society however, we saw a different story. The Society provided the children in their care with education and support, taking great care of their differing needs. During our visit, we had the privilege of meeting fifteen hearing impaired children, lovingly cared for by six devoted nuns. Despite the unique challenges they faced, the children at Navjeevan Society prepared a heartwarming welcome for us. They presented us with handmade flowers and mesmerized us with their beautiful dance performances, all the while reminding us that, true strength comes from conquering challenges, once thought insurmountable. Our visiting Student Council members also presented some entertaining solo dances, group performances and mime acts, fostering an atmosphere of joy and camaraderie. Amidst laughter and learning, the visit to Navjeevan Society proved to be a day well spent, leaving us with warm memories, which will be cherished for a lifetime. Witnessing the joy and resilience of these hearing impaired children will inspire us to seek out every opportunity in our day to day lives, to reach out to those in need, even in small ways.

The success of the Charity Drive would not have been possible without the dedicated efforts of our Council students. They played a crucial role in collecting and packing the donated items, which included pulses, sugar, dry snacks, wheat flour, soaps, detergents, bedsheets and towels. They also planned entertainment programs and arranged games for the children at Navjeevan Society. The highlight was the generous gift of a computer, donated by our Principal, Bro. Wilfred Monteiro. This visit undoubtedly made a significant difference in the lives of these children.

During this visit we observed the profound impact of charity first hand. Our young students saw the transformative power of compassion and generosity and understood how this can foster a strong sense of community. They also came face to face with the critically important issue of upholding the rights of the disabled to have access to education and basic facilities. As we returned to our school, we carried with us the realization that greatness lies not in what we have, but in what we give.

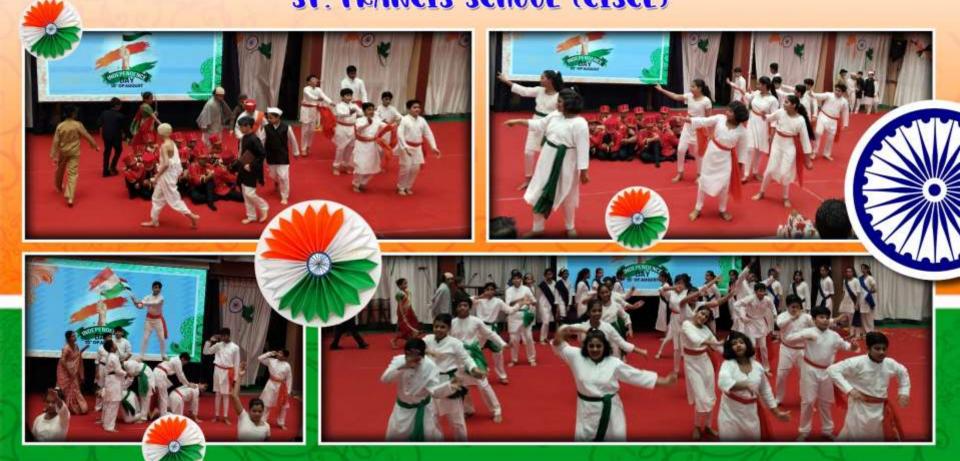


































Celebrating the soul of our nation

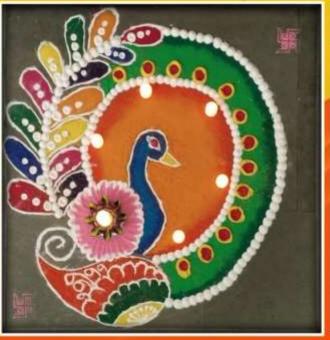

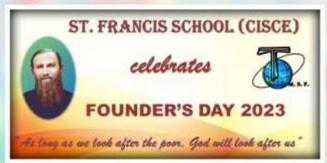
FOUNDER'S DAY

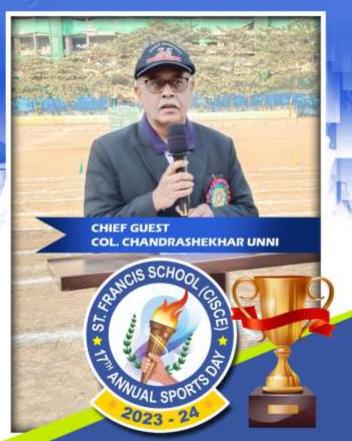




























































A firm resolve to preserve our democratic ideals

VISIT TO IdZania

Our school organized an educational cum fun tour to 'KidZania'- an indoor educational and entertainment theme park for families and kids at R-City Mall in Ghatkopar on 7th July 2023. A total of1076 from Classes 1 to 7were accompanied by 54 staff members for this field trip. An orientation was given to students two days earlier during school hours, by a KidZania representative. This helped to give them an idea of the theme 'LEARNING WITH FUN', and the rules and activities at Kidzania, filling them with a sense of excitement.

On an average, an activity was for about 20 to 25 minutes so one could possibly try out around 12 to 15 activities in a day. The activities could broadly be divided into those for entertainment or learning (for which one has to pay KidZos) and work for which they get paid for their efforts. Students enjoyed activities like making your own Cadbury chocolate, Mad over doughnuts, pizzas and also role playing various professions around the world like hospital staff, departmental store helper, radio host, tiffin delivery, courier service, police, DJ and so on. 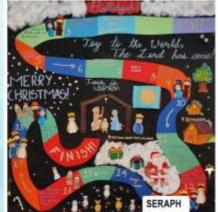


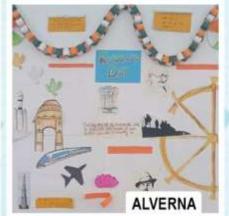














THANKSGIVING DAY SERVICE...
